### Features of the program

The educational program in business administration is focused on combining theoretical and practical training of students and is the first stage of career development. Provides for modern educational technologies and participation in real projects of commercial and public organizations, authorities, grant programs. The educational program includes practical training and seminars with leading specialists and mentors in the business. During the training, applicants have the opportunity to create and run their startups.

Well-known practitioners are invited to teach professionally oriented disciplines, who actively combine scientific work with practical activities, which allows applicants to acquire scientific and practical knowledge and Skills.

The program provides an opportunity to undergo internships abroad. Some disciplines are taught in English.

There is a possibility of mobility under the Erasmus + program, and all students participate in special seminars together with students participating in the Erasmus + program.

The program envisages the possibility of training applicants according to individual curricula using elements of dual education.

### 8 - Resource support for the implementation of the program

### Specific characteristics of personnel support

The implementation of educational activities within the framework of the OP is carried out by specialists, 96% of whom have a scientific degree, including 86% - candidates of sciences, associate professors; 10% — doctors of economic sciences, professors; 32% have experience in practical activities according to the program profile. Business representatives, local self-government bodies, and other stakeholders are actively involved in the training process.

# Specific characteristics of material and technical support

Material and technical support for the implementation of the Programm is carried out on the basis of:

- a media room equipped with a PC, a projector, wireless and wired microphones, a projector screen, wall speakers, a sound amplifier and a wired camera;
- classrooms equipped with PCs, projectors, wireless microphones, projector screens, wall speakers, sound amplifiers and wired cameras;
   computer classes equipped with PCs, laptops with available Internet access channels;
- in all premises where the educational process is carried out, there is access to Wi-Fi Internet.

For classes in a distance format, there is appropriate material and technical equipment that ensures the full implementation of the educational process. The system includes appropriate technologies and software that provide convenient access to educational materials,

For the Programm information support:

- the library is stocked with domestic and foreign specialist periodicals of the relevant or related profile, including in electronic form;
- free access to full-text databases of journals of foreign and domestic publishers is provided: SCOPUS, Web of Science, EBSCO, Royal Society of Chemistry, Oxford University Press, Cambridge University Press, SpringerNature (journals\*) CUL Online, Springer Link:

more than 20 names of professional publications are at the disposal of applicants;

- there is an official website of the educational institution, which contains basic information about its activities, and access to the Moodle remote platform is provided;
- there is a website of the Karazin School of Business, which provides detailed information about the educational program (curriculums, work programs of academic disciplines), the department responsible for its implementation, and also provides information about the results of the public discussion;
- in the case of the occurrence / prolongation of force majeure (including martial law, the introduction of strict quarantine restrictions in the conditions of a pandemic, with a ban on visiting higher education institutions), applicants are given access to a personal office, from which they can access the schedule of classes, the results of the current and semester control; classes are held using Google Meet, Zoom, Cisco Webex, etc. platforms.

For educational and methodological support of the Program:

- the educational and professional program, curricula, according to which higher education applicants are trained, were approved in the established order;

- access to methodical materials for the final certification of higher education applicants was provided.



### 3. Form of attestation of applicants for higher education

The abstract of the qualification work should be published on the official website of the Karazin Business School, on the basis of which this educational program is implemented.
