Karazin University has Opened its Second location for educators under the program "Providing Primary Medical Assistance to Educational Recipients"





On August 25, 2023, the Simulation Center of the School of Medicine at Karazin University has been opened its second location for professional trainings in Kharkiv under the working educational program titled "Providing Primary Medical Assistance to Educational Recipients." The Director of the Postgraduate Education Center, Mykhailo Tatarinov, conducted a safety briefing for the participants, ensuring compliance with safety requirements, and familiarized them with the specifics of conducting practical sessions on airway obstruction and providing primary aid. Assistant Professor of the Institute of General Surgery, Anesthesiology, and Palliative Medicine at the School of Medicine, Ivan Rudas, conducted practical and training sessions with the participants on the relevant topics. He collaborated with them to ensure the completion of exercises related to the use of simulators. Participants in the training began to develop the necessary competencies.

Karazin University is Participating in Training for Coaches of Future Veteran Assistants





In Kyiv, training for coaching teams of future veteran assistants at the regional level is currently underway. This initiative is organized by the Ministry of Veterans Affairs of Ukraine with the generous support of UNDP in Ukraine and international donors. Twenty scientists and educators from leading higher education institutions are undergoing an intensive course titled 'Theory and Practice of Training Specialists in the Support of War Veterans and Demobilized Persons,' which is a part of the experimental project initiated by the Ministry of Veterans Affairs to introduce the concept of veteran assistants in Ukraine. Future veteran assistants will be trained in Centers for Veteran Development established within higher education institutions, including Karazin University, as a part of the Ministry of Veterans Affairs' initiative. During three days of training, participants develop an understanding of the process of preparing specialists who will support veterans and demobilized individuals within the approved qualification improvement program. They also examine theoretical and practical aspects of veteran support during the transition from military service to civilian life, including psychological and communication nuances in working with veterans and their families, organization of work, and document flow for specialists in veteran support, among other topics.

Strong health and well-being — training specialists to support veterans ensures access to mental health services, psychosocial support, and reintegration.

Visit of WHO Representatives to the University





The importance of healthcare during wartime—global challenges in ensuring health security and adapting healthcare systems in crisis situations.

On March 15, the representatives of the Ukrainian and international offices of the World Health Organization (WHO) visited Karazin University during a working visit.

For significant contribution to the development of sports, Valerii Dema awarded the team of Karazin University with an award from the NOC branch of Ukraine in the Kharkiv region.



A Training on "First Psychological Support"

Training in psychological first aid (PFA) helps expand access to support tools for vulnerable groups and builds students' capacity to assist in crisis situations. This aligns with SDG target 3.4: reducing mortality from mental disorders and improving mental well-being.

Karazin University pays significant attention to deepening knowledge about mental health. The ability to provide first psychological support is extremely important, as it can be useful not only in times of crisis but also in our everyday lives.

For students of the School of Psychology, representatives of the International Swiss humanitarian organization "Medair" conducted a training on providing Psychological First Aid (PFA). Participants gathered in a safe space within the university and were able to experience the warmth of personal communication.

Students deepened their knowledge of the basic principles of supporting individuals affected by crisis situations, learned about the application of PFA principles and role-playing games, and the specifics of working with vulnerable population groups that may require special attention.

Stress Awareness Day







Stress Awareness Day highlights the importance of understanding and managing stress as a key factor in both physical and mental health.

April 16th is Stress Awareness Day, observed annually at the initiative of the British International Stress Management Association.

Stress - is the body's reaction to factors that potentially threaten a person's physical and mental health. These factors can vary: job loss, the death of a loved one, physical overload, or working under time constraints.

Stress can arise from minor issues as well as more tragic situations, triggering emotional reactions in individuals accompanied by a range of physiological and psychological disturbances. It's known that stress is the cause of perhaps 90% of all illnesses.

Events of today, which do not allow for relaxation and rest, especially exacerbate the stressful situation. Whether at the center of events, observing them, or just browsing through the constantly updating news feed, we all, even involuntarily, feel the influence of stress factors. The main symptoms of stress include:

Severe fatigue, inattention;

Irritability, aggression;

Anxiety, excessive worry;

Baseless fears:

Memory disorders;

Regular physical ailments;

Difficulties in relationships with family or loved ones, spending less time with them;

Lack of desire to return to work or inefficiency at work;

Feeling of alienation, lack of recognition in society.

Usually, it's difficult for a person to prepare for a stressful situation in advance, but it is possible to anticipate and prepare for stressful events. It's noted that positive social support (family, friends, colleagues, like-minded groups) can be one of the most important factors in a person's stress resilience.

Improving the quality of medical education. Medical students at Karazin University have gained access to the modern educational platform of the University of Regensburg, which contributes to the training of qualified professionals in the field of healthcare.



As part of the academic mobility program under the memorandum of cooperation with the University of Regensburg, second-year students of the School of Medicine of Karazin University participated in an internship in medical microbiology.

Students enhanced their knowledge of bacterial differentiation methods, independently performed Gram staining and microscopy of specimens, learned the technique of Ziehl-Neelsen staining, conducted microscopic observation of bacteria in real-time, and improved their knowledge of spore and capsule microscopy.

Within the program, the students studied the biochemical properties of bacteria, conducted bacterial testing for antibiotic resistance, and PCR analysis of nasal swabs for MRSA.

During the practical training, they improved their skills in using light and fluorescent microscopy and acquired many other practical skills.

With the support of the Dean of the School of Biology and Preclinical Medicine, Professor Ralph Witzgall, and with the direct involvement of Dr. Robert Reichheld and the Coordinator of the Department of Medical Microbiology, Dr. Benedict Asbach, Karazin students not only deepened their theoretical knowledge of medical microbiology but also practically improved their skills and mastered methods of preparing microbiological preparations and their microscopy.

As part of the student exchange program, second-year students from the School of Medicine of Karazin University participated in a series of in-person physiology classes based on the cooperation memorandum with the University of Regensburg.

With the support of the Dean of the School of Biology and Preclinical Medicine, Professor Ralph Wittig, and the participation of Professor Frank Schwed from the University of Regensburg, Karazin students were introduced to German standards in higher medical education. Associate Professor Vera Shekh from the Department of Human and Animal Physiology of the School of Biology of Karazin University, who is on scientific and pedagogical internship for teachers at the University of Regensburg, also joined the classes.

The future doctors independently performed laboratory work on ECG registration and analysis, blood flow in arterial and venous vessels, heart activity regulation, local and systemic blood circulation, cardiovascular and respiratory system physiology, sensory system studies, physiological basis of behavior, and blood system physiology.

Practical skills training was conducted using modern equipment, including an electrocardiograph, an adjustable table with tilt, Goldman's perimeter projector, a soundproof booth for hearing tests, express blood group test, spirometer, tonometer, electromyograph, and more.
