On 18 March, at the initiative of the Department of Political Science of the School of Philosophy, an interdisciplinary expert meeting was held within the framework of the project Working towards resilient societies in the EaP: Challenges and opportunities for the policy beyond 2020, an interdisciplinary expert meeting was held with the participation of Karazin University.

The participants of the expert meeting assessed the challenges faced by various sectors of Ukraine in the context of the war and how Ukrainian society is coping with this shocking event. According to the experts, digitalisation and organisational scaling of public and private sector institutions are the key tools for ensuring resilience.



The project is being implemented with the assistance of the European Union and the participation of such higher education institutions as ADA University (Azerbaijan), Ivane Javakhishvili Tbilisi State University (Georgia), and the University of Warwick (UK). This project aims to develop recommendations for the European Commission to implement the concept of resilience in the Eastern Partnership countries.

On June 14, Karazin University was visited by representatives of the government, business, educational sector, and scientists to discuss common problems and prospects for cooperation at the forum "Education. Science. Business" forum.

During the event, Karazin University scientists presented cases aimed at solving current problems:

- restoring agricultural land, in particular, in terms of demining of hazardous areas to restore and strengthen the agricultural sector in Kharkiv region;
- cyber-physical technologies, nuclear medicine and energy, a project of the International Centre for Nuclear Medicine to treat patients with radiosurgical methods;
- psychophysical rehabilitation of military and civilians affected by hostilities: creation of specialised teams to provide comprehensive care and innovative developments to restore tissue of the affected persons;
- restoring the supply of quality drinking water to the population, minimising the risks caused by constant shelling of infrastructure and terrorist acts by Russia;
- using artificial intelligence in control systems to restore economic activity of industrial enterprises in Kharkiv region, including diagnostics and automation of production processes.

Karazin University, in collaboration with the University of York, participated in a seminar as part of the Kharkiv-York Partnership Towards a Zero Pollution Environment in Post-War Ukraine project



On August 29-30, 2023, a seminar was held at the University of York in the UK as part of the Kharkiv-York Partnership Towards a Zero Pollution Environment in Post-War Ukraine project, which was attended by 14 PhD students and Karazin University professors.

The seminar was attended by the Vice-Chancellor of the University of York, Professor Abrose Field, Director of the Centre for New Crops at the University of York, Professor Neil Bruce, Project Manager from the University of York, Professor Alistair Boxall, and researchers from the Conflict and Environment Observatory, Anna McKeon and Johan Darbyshire. Karazin University was represented by Vice-Rector for Research and Teaching, Professor Borys Samorodov, Acting Head of the Department of Ecology and Environmental Management, Professor Andrii Achasov, and Director of the Education and Research Institute of Ecology, Associate Professor Hanna Titenko.

The seminar discussed ways to achieve an ecologically clean environment in post-war Ukraine, including the creation of transgenic plants for phytoremediation of explosives contamination. They discussed the possibilities of conducting joint research and training with the University of York to find ways to combat environmental pollution, as well as the specifics of assessing and restoring Ukrainian soils that were contaminated as a result of military operations. They also focused on prioritizing and finding funding for future joint projects.

He highlighted that today, over two million Ukrainians reside in Poland, and he thanked the entire democratic community for their support of Ukraine. He also reminded everyone about the possibility of helping the university through the Kharkiv Karazin University Foundation.

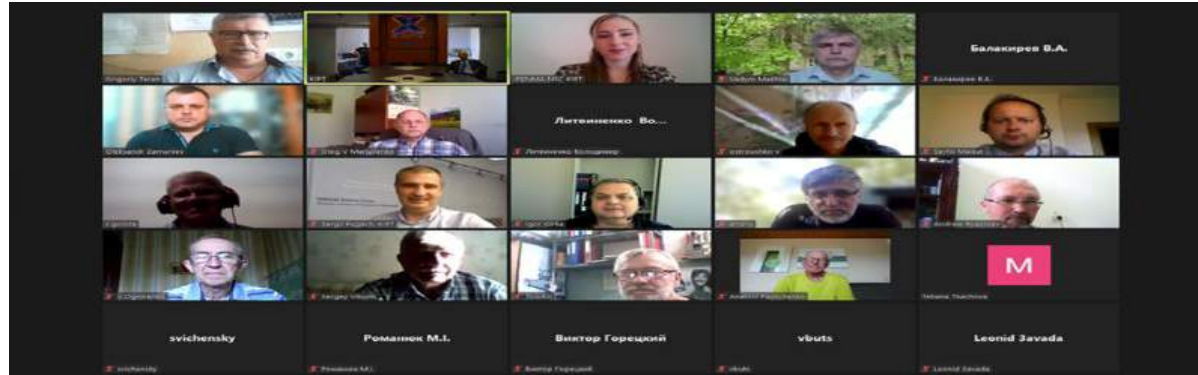

From 14 to 17 August 2023, Södertörn University (Stockholm, Sweden) hosted an international summer symposium "Ukrainian Studies in Sweden. Methodological Problems and Prospects" for Ukrainian and Swedish researchers in the humanities. 15 Ukrainian and 7 Swedish researchers worked in six sections and several discussions. Karazin University was represented by two scholars in the fields of history and philology.



The event was attended by Olena Matushek, Head of the Department of History of Ukrainian Literature, Professor, and Nataliia Aksionova, Associate Professor of the Department of Tourism Business and Country Studies. Accordingly, they delivered presentations on "The Image of Ivan Mazepa in the Literature of the Ukrainian Baroque" and "Ethnological Seminars in the Format of a Folk Festival: Achievements and Prospects." The event was aimed at discussing issues of Ukrainian research in Sweden and networking in Ukrainian-Swedish studies. The participants shared their research experience, held interesting discussions, and got acquainted with the work of the Centre for Baltic and East European Studies, which has a printed publication *Baltic Worlds*, which informs the world about the nature, causes, course and consequences of Russian aggression in each issue. Ukrainian researchers from 13 universities were impressed by the fact that the University of Södertörn raises Ukrainian flags alongside the flags of Sweden every day as a sign of support for Ukraine.
