


#### Student Marta Fedina, as part of the national team, won a bronze medal at the World Aquatics Championships







#### Karazin University Lecturer Delivers Guest Lecture "Critical Media Literacy in Building Information Resilience"

- and, additionally, work with a psychologist.








#### Special thematic specialized summer courses and summer thematic specialized schools on subjects for teachers of educational institutions have started at Karazin University


Timothy Snyder thanked us for this meeting and promised to come back to Kharkiv and visit Karazin University next year.

## The International Seminar "Plasma Electronics and New Acceleration Methods"





## International Day of Women and Girls in Science: the University congratulates

February 11 is the International Day of Women and Girls in Science. This memorable date was established by the United Nations and has been celebrated since 2016.

Representatives of Karazin University have always done a lot for the development of women's education, which primarily created a social basis for girls and women to enter science.

For example, the founder of the university, Vasyl Karazin, advocated in the early 19th century that education should be accessible to all, regardless of age or gender. And in 1842, he substantiated the importance of education for girls who belonged to the serfdom, the least socially protected stratum of the population. This idea was realized after his death.

Karazin University has become one of the flagships of women's education in our country and, together with other higher education institutions, has trained entire generations of women scientists and researchers. After all, it was here that women were granted the right to receive education for the first time in Ukraine at that time. In particular, historian Oleksandra Yefymenko became the first woman to receive an honorary doctorate. She was awarded this title by the Academic Council of Kharkiv University in 1910.








# The working group meeting on the implementation of the project "Gender Education for Foreign Students"

Karazin University hosted a meeting of the working group on the project "Gender Education for International Students", which has been implemented since February 2023 by the NGO La Strada-Ukraine in cooperation with V. # **World Water Day**



March 22 marks the thirtieth consecutive year of World Water Day. This international day of remembrance was established in 1993 by the UN General Assembly as a reminder of the importance of water for sustainable economic development and social well-being. On this day, events are held around the world to raise awareness of the general public about the need to preserve clean water resources and their rational development.

Many representatives of Kharkiv University have been studying the water resources of our region at different times, taking care of their conservation and careful use. For example, the founder of the University Vasyl Karazin wrote about the need to preserve clean and full-flowing rivers, which is primarily directly affected by the preservation of forests. He also developed plans to clean up riverbeds in Kharkiv and studied the healing properties of mineral waters from springs in the Orel River basin.

Representatives of Kharkiv University were actively engaged in the study of water resources in the following years. In particular, in 1862, a special commission of Karazin Universit's School of Medicine concluded that Berezivka mineral waters were similar in chemical composition to the water of the Spa spring (in Belgium) and could be used for medicinal purposes, which marked the beginning of the famous balneological resort.

# **World Meteorological Day**

March 23 is World Meteorological Day. It was established in 1961 at the initiative of the World Meteorological Organization, which operates under the auspices of the United Nations.

Its main goal is to demonstrate the significant contribution of national meteorological and hydrological services to the safety and well-being of society. Each year, a special theme is chosen for World Meteorological Day related to weather, climate and water research. In 2023, the theme is "Change Yourself, Change the Future," which encourages people to take action in their own lives to change the way they use and consume water and manage water resources.

Vasyl Karazin, the founder of Kharkiv University, was one of the first to advocate the importance of meteorology as a science and applied field of activity.

In 1810, he was the first in the world to express the idea of the need to create a wide network of meteorological stations for comprehensive weather observations. The scientist wrote: "These observations will be the most important service for meteorology and will make it an exact science, that is, the science of calculating and predicting the weather in a certain place and time." He organized the first meteorological station in Ukraine on his estate in the village of Kruchyk (in the modern Bohodukhiv district of Kharkiv region) and conducted research there for several decades.

Today, meteorological issues are studied at the School of Geology, Geography, Recreation and Tourism of Karazin University.

#### Karazin University students participate in "Euratom Research in Action and Opportunities for Europe: Strategic Autonomy of the EU and Energy Systems of the Future"

On April 4, 2023, the European Parliament hosted a conference "Euratom Research in Action and Opportunities for Europe: EU Strategic Autonomy and Future Energy Systems" in Brussels (Belgium).

The event was chaired by the European Commissioner for Innovation, Research, Culture, Education and Youth, Mariya Gabriel, and Director General of the EU Directorate-General for Research and Innovation, Marc Lemaitre.

The conference was also attended by the Ukrainian delegation, which included, in particular, Ihor Harkusha, Head of the Department of Applied Physics and Plasma Physics at the Education and Research Institute of School of Physics and Technology, Academician of the National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine, Ihor Hirka, Director of the Education and Research Institute of School of Physics and Technology, Corresponding Member of the National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine, and graduates of the Education and Research Institute of School of Physics and Technology Serhii Fomin, Dmytro Burdeinyi, and Hanna Skrypka.



The conference focused on the development of small modular reactors, including licensing, safety and non-proliferation, supervision of power grids, fuel extraction and disposal. The main thesis is that SMRs (small modular reactors) do not replace VVER-1000s (water-water power reactors), but complement them. There are already six versions of SMRs in Europe. They should be economically viable, i.e. easy to operate and cheap.




#### Solar power plants are a step towards sustainable development and energy independence: the university will provide itself with energy

#### **Karazin University's main building turns 60**



The main university building always attracts the attention of Kharkiv citizens and guests of our city. For a long time, it was the tallest secular building in Kharkiv. Built in 1929-1932 in Kharkiv, it became known as "the House of Projects".

The constructivist skyscraper of the first third of the 20th century was heavily damaged during the Second World War and was transferred to the university in 1950. It took thirteen years to rebuild it. On 7 September 1963, the main building was inaugurated. The university received 61,000 square metres of space.

The architects of the building were Serhii Serafimov and Mariia Zandberg-Serafimova. The building was rebuilt by university staff and students under the guidance of architects and designers Veniamin Kostenko, Alexander Kasyanov, Vladimir Lipkin and others.

The main building of the university is a historical, cultural and architectural monument of local importance. It is associated with the activities of prominent scientists of the 20th and 21st centuries: astronomer Mykola Barabashov and mathematician Oleksii Pogorelov, physicist Ilya Lifshits and psychologist Petro Zinchenko, sociologist Olena Yakuba and archaeologist Borys Shramko, and many others.

The main building of Karazin University is a jewel of the city, national science and education. This year, it has welcomed thousands of new applicants, masters and postgraduate students. # **International Day of Forests**

On March 21, the world celebrates the International Day of Forests. This memorable date was introduced by the UN General Assembly on November 28, 2012, and its first celebration took place in 2013. The main purpose of this memorable day is to remind humanity of the need to protect and preserve the forest resources of our planet.

Today, about 30% of the world's land is covered by forests, and the plants and animals that live in them account for up to 80% of the world's biodiversity. Forests play a key role in stabilizing the Earth's climate, providing food, water and medicine to billions of people. The 13th Sustainable Development Goal of the United Nations ("Mitigating the effects of climate change") is linked to forest conservation.



Vasyl Karazin, the founder of Kharkiv University and a prominent Ukrainian naturalist, was concerned about the preservation of forests in the first half of the nineteenth century. In his writings, he proved the favorable impact of forests on the climate and water balance of rivers, called for the protection of forests from ill-considered deforestation, pointed out the need to plant trees in beams and ravines, and to reforest sandy areas unsuitable for agriculture, thus organically combining environmental issues with economic ones. The educator also became one of the pioneers of steppe reforestation and in his writings gave advice on the optimal selection of tree crops, soil selection, etc.



Karazin University, in collaboration with the University of York, participated in a seminar as part of the Kharkiv-York Partnership Towards a Zero Pollution Environment in Post-War Ukraine project



On August 29-30, 2023, a seminar was held at the University of York in the UK as part of the Kharkiv-York Partnership Towards a Zero Pollution Environment in Post-War Ukraine project, which was attended by 14 PhD students and Karazin University professors.

The seminar was attended by the Vice-Chancellor of the University of York, Professor Abrose Field, Director of the Centre for New Crops at the University of York, Professor Neil Bruce, Project Manager from the University of York, Professor Alistair Boxall, and researchers from the Conflict and Environment Observatory, Anna McKeon and Johan Darbyshire. Karazin University was represented by Vice-Rector for Research and Teaching, Professor Borys Samorodov, Acting Head of the Department of Ecology and Environmental Management, Professor Andrii Achasov, and Director of the Education and Research Institute of Ecology, Associate Professor Hanna Titenko.

The seminar discussed ways to achieve an ecologically clean environment in post-war Ukraine, including the creation of transgenic plants for phytoremediation of explosives contamination. They discussed the possibilities of conducting joint research and training with the University of York to find ways to combat environmental pollution, as well as the specifics of assessing and restoring Ukrainian soils that were contaminated as a result of military operations. They also focused on prioritizing and finding funding for future joint projects.

# Finalizing the project "Recording the damage caused to the natural complexes of the Kharkiv region as a result of the war"



The experts of the Karazin Education and Research Institute of Ecology, as part of the working group of the NGO Environmental Geographic Information Systems of Ukraine, have completed their work on the project "Recording the damage caused to natural complexes of the Kharkiv region as a result of the war". The research was conducted within the framework of the Initiative for the Development of Environmental Policy and Advocacy in Ukraine, implemented by the International Renaissance Foundation with financial support from Sweden.

The territory of the Kharkiv region, where active hostilities were conducted from February 24, 2022 to October 15, 2022, was surveyed. The total area surveyed was 21,063 km<sup>2</sup>.

In the course of the work, approximately more than 17,000 satellite images were examined. Based on the results of satellite image interpretation, more than 61 thousand craters formed as a result of ammunition hits were recorded. The results of the work are presented on the open geospatial data portal EcoSpace.



# Freshmen Initiation into Students of Karazin University at the Educational Hub in Munich. Germany




